CONDUCT OF GRADUATION/COMPLETION CEREMONIES FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2016-2017

Elementary and Secondary School Heads

- 1. To ensure smooth and solemn conduct of Graduation/Completion Ceremonies for SY 2015-2016 this Office issues the following guidelines:
 - a. The top ten learners from Grades 1 to 12 shall be ranked using the 7-3 point scheme. Determine by using 7 points for academic and 3 points for co-curricular activities following DepEd Order No. 74, s. 2012.
 - b. Titles for learners with honors including valedictorian, salutatorian, first honorable mention, and so forth shall be used <u>for Grade 6</u> and <u>Grade 12</u> **but not for Grade 10 completers** per DepEd Order No. 15, s. 2016.
 - Sample template for certificates attached to DepEd Order No. 7, s. 2016 shall be followed.
 - 2. The 2016 Graduation Message of Secretary Bro. Armin Luistro, FSC shall be included in the program and to be read during the graduation/completion ceremonies.
 - 3. Attached are the sample program and confirmation message for the Completion Rites/Ceremonies only. @raduation/Completion Ceremonies be made simple and solemn.
- 4. Small secondary schools are encouraged to hold Recognition for Grades 7-9 and Completion Rites for Grade 10 as one activity or Recognition in the morning and Completion Rites in the afternoon. Likewise small elementary schools are advised to do the same for Recognition and Graduation Ceremonies.
- 5. Schools Division Office Personnel, School Heads and Teachers are advised to observe the proper dress code during said occasion.
