REVITALIZING SCHOOL LEARNING RESOURCE CENTERS / SCHOOL LIBRARIES IN DEPED REGION V

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent Chiefs, CID, SGOD Public Schools District Supervisors Elementary and Secondary School Heads All Others Concerned

- 1. In support to the Regional Memorandum no. 22 s. 2023 "Revitalizing School Learning Resources Centers / School Libraries in Deped Region V" the Curriculum Implementation Division through the Learning Resource Management Section will conduct Search for Most Functional Learning Resource Center / School Libraries, Best Reading Corner / Nook and Outstanding Teacher Librarian in the division.
- 2. This is to recognize the significant role of librarians designate who demonstrate innovative practices that contributed to learners reading and literacy performance. All schools are encouraged to join the search.
- 3. Public Schools Districts Supervisors will nominate one elementary and one secondary school top functional school library from their respective district. Each of them should submit to the Division Office one nominee for each of the following categories on or before September 29, 2023:
 - a. Most Functional School LRC / Library (1 elementary, 1 secondary)
 - b. Best Reading Nook / Corner (1 elementary, 1 secondary)
 - c. Outstanding Teacher Librarian (1 elementary, 1 secondary)
- 4. Entries shall be judged according to the following qualifications and criteria:
- A. Most Functional School Learning Resource Centers / School Library
 - · All Elementary and Secondary schools are qualified to join.

 - a. Title of Innovation
 - b. Objectives of the Innovation
 - c. Highlight of the Implementation
 - d. Impact of the Innovation to learners
 - e. Testimonies (if needed)
- 6. An accompanying write up of not more than 1000 words should also be submitted, in A4 sized bond paper (double spaced, 12 Font Size, Bookman Old Style), duly signed by the nominee and attested by the School Head. The nominee is encouraged to discuss extensively the highlights of the innovation and its impact to





the target users. A close- up picture of the nominee should be attached to the write - up.

- 7. A multi-media presentation, scanned copy of the write- up and close up picture of the nominee and scanned copy of Endorsement of the Schools Division Office Superintendent should be coursed through Ms. Peachie Roshele T. Chavez, LRMS Librarian, with email address: peachieroshele.chavez@deped.gov.ph on or before September 29, 2023.
- 8. A Division Validation Team will visit the school and the librarian designate nominee for interviews and validation of the program / innovation on October 3-5, 2023 prior to the announcement of the winners. Winning entries for Most Functional School LRC / Library to be submitted for Regional Level of the Competition.
- 9. An Awarding Ceremony will be held on a date to be announced in advisory.
- 10. Immediate and widest dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
